Computer courses for beginners

Unity is pleased to offer free IT training to tenants, their families and friends. We hold once-a-week classes that last for five weeks and cover:

-  Turning the computer on and off
-  Moving the cursor and clicking using a mouse
-  Typing with the keyboard
-  Using a word processor
-  Using an Internet browser
-  Using email
-  Sending emails with attachments
-  Using a memory stick
-  Registering for services using your email address

Did you know?

The Government intend to introduce Universal Credit to benefit claimants. This means that people claiming a range of benefits will no longer have separate claims for benefits but will have to submit a claim for a single monthly payment.

Universal Credit claimants will have to complete an online form. This means that if you need to make a claim you will need to access the Internet.

Also, Jobseeker's Allowance claimants may have to prove that they have been searching and applying for jobs online in order to maintain a claim. You may have to use an online Government Service called Universal Jobmatch in order to do this.
